Study No. 3 - Jesus Christ: God and Man

I. The Identity of Jesus Christ

II. The Work of Jesus Christ

- 1. Since Jesus is both God and man, He is able to do the following:
 - a. <u>Be God's Perfect Revelation of Himself to us.</u> In John 14:6, He said, "*I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me.*"
 - b. <u>Be our Perfect Representative before God.</u> He can act fully on our behalf. According to 1 John 2:1 "... *if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.*"
 - i. <u>He has taken the punishment for our sins on our behalf.</u> "For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God." (1 Peter 3:18)
 - ii. <u>He has also lived a sinless, righteous and holy life on our behalf.</u> "For he hath made Him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him." (2 Corinthians 5:21; see also John 8:46, Hebrews 4:15, 1 Peter 2:22 and 1 John 3:5.)
- 2. This work of revealing God to man and representing man before God is the work of Jesus Christ as our Mediator. "*For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;*" (1 Timothy 2:5)
- 3. The result of this work is that Jesus Christ **reconciles** sinners to God. "*For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life.*" (Romans 5:10)
- 4. Through this work of Jesus you can now be reconciled to God. Through His death on your behalf, you can now have forgiveness of all your sins. And through His perfect, sinless life, you can now be regarded as being righteous and holy enough to fellowship with God. Through Him therefore, it is now possible for you to know God personally!
