Give Attendance to Reading

"Till I come, give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine [teaching]." (1 Timothy 4:13)

It was Sir Francis Bacon (1561 – 1626), an English author, courtier, and philosopher, who said, "Reading maketh a full man, conference a ready man, and writing an exact man." He stressed the importance of good reading habit, and reading widely to achieve a comprehensive range of knowledge. Indeed, reading allows one to become confident and gain the propensity towards maturity. Bacon emphasised that through reading, one becomes a "full man" or matured person. The Apostle Paul instructed young Pastor Timothy to "give attendance to reading" in 1 Timothy 4:13. As a leader, Timothy was to give attention to both private and public reading of the Scriptures. He needed to be an example to his congregation in reading and meditating the Scriptures privately. Once he had his communion with God, he could then give exhortation to his flock, which is also much needed today. By exhortation, he communicates God's commandments and instructions for Christian living to his flock. By teaching, he is to make disciples for the Lord Jesus Christ, and to indoctrinate them in the way of the Lord Jesus Christ.

"They read from the book, from the Law of God, clearly, and they gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading." (Nehemiah 8:8)

When revival came to the Jews in the time of Nehemiah, one

of the first acts of devotion and worship was the reading of the Scriptures. For years, the people of God had neglected the reading of the Law of God. Hence, Ezra read from the Law of God and together with the leaders "gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading"! If we want revival in our church, we must go back to the reading of God's Word.

"And Baruch the son of Neriah did all that Jeremiah the prophet ordered him about reading from the scroll the words of the LORD in the LORD's house." (Jeremiah 36:8)

We are told in the opening verses of Jeremiah 36 that God told Jeremiah to write down His judgments against Israel and Judah and all the nations in a scroll. The prophet then ordered Baruch the son of Neriah to write down the words of the Lord into the scroll. After that, he also ordered Baruch to read the words of the Lord which he had written to the Jews. God has spoken, we are to read it!

"Behold, a man of Ethiopia, an eunuch of great authority under Candace queen of the Ethiopians, who had the charge of all her treasure, and had come to Jerusalem for to worship, was returning, and sitting in his chariot read Esaias the prophet." (Acts 8:26-27)

In the New Testament, God sent Dn Philip to minister to an Ethiopian eunuch who was a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians. This Ethiopian eunuch was a very powerful man since he was in charge of all of the queen's

treasure. The Holy Spirit led this man to read the words of the prophet Isaiah. Philip was sent to explain the gospel to him. Subsequently, he was soundly converted and became born again. "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." (Romans 10:17) The reading of God's Word brings about conversion of souls. Hallelujah!
